Seasonal Container Reservation Program (SCRP)

This courtesy service is officially underway so please set your reminders! Reservations are on a first-come, first-served basis due to limited staffing.

Containers will be dropped off between 7:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m. on the scheduled day. WFWRD staff will try to ensure that residents have up to 24 hours with the container. Driveways must be clear, accessible, and have enough room (approximately 10' x 20') for the container to be placed off the street and out of the public sidewalk. If the driveway is inaccessible, the container will not be delivered, and you will lose your opportunity for the container at your residence.
