Finally, Evan earned dual graduate degrees in Public Affairs and Environmental Science from Indiana University’s School of Public and Environmental Affairs, holds a variety of certifications from the Solid Waste Association of North America (SWANA), and is a Certified Hazardous Materials Manager (CHMM).

### Monthly Billing is Coming in 2026!

We’re making a change to serve you better — starting **January 2026**, we’ll be moving from **quarterly billing** to a **monthly billing cycle**.

This change will mean smaller, easier-to-manage bills, and a simpler way to keep track of your services.

Here is how the transition will work:

- Your **January 2026 bill** will cover **October–December 2025 services**.
- Then, in **February 2026**, you’ll get your first **monthly bill** (just for January services).
- From **March 2026 forward**, you’ll receive a bill **every month** for the previous month’s services.

**A quick reminder:** As we move into 2026, please take this change into account when planning your household budget. We will continue to share reminders and updates along the way.
